


Our story as a town starts thanks to the abundance of subterranean reservoirs. These made it possible for Algodonales to be a busy settlement from the Neolithic, and a fortified Iberian town that was inhabited till the Roman era. The path between the two fountains will allow you to explore the best sights of the town.

Top Fountain























Algodonales was founded at the base of the Lijar Sierra, a mountain range with plenty of subterranean water streams that emerge from the most unsuspected places such as La Higuera, Cabera, Zapatera, Las Víboras,

Dornajo, Cristóbal Gómez, La Laína y Sierra. There are also two

fountains over a hundred years old, which have had an extraordinary influence on the history of the town: Fuente Alta and Fuente Baja, whose streams water the nearby orchards, quench the thirst of the locals and are still strong enough to join and form the Batan stream, leading to the Guadalete river.
